STATEMENT ADDRESSING NONDISCRIMINATORY AND INTERCONNECT OBLIGATION

KPUD Nondiscrimination and Interconnection complies with the nondiscrimination and network interconnection obligations set forth in section V.C.2.c of the NOFA and in Section 6001(j) of the Recovery Act. Within the Recovery Act, NTIA requires that KPUD complies with five obligations.

1. Adhere to the principles contained in the FCC Broadband Policy Statement (FCC 05-151 adopted Aug. 5, 2005) – KPUD adheres to the principles contained in the FCC Broadband Policy Statement (FCC – 05-151 adopted Aug. 5, 2005)
2. Not favor any lawful Internet applications or content over others. – KPUD complies.
3. Display network management policies in a prominent location on the service providers web page and provide notice to customers of changes to these policies – KPUD complies and has Master Service Agreement available at www.washingtonbroadband.org or www.kpud.org and does provide notices to customers of any policy changes
4. Connect to the public Internet directly or indirectly, such that the project is not an entirely private closed network – KPUD complies.
5. Offer interconnection, where technically feasible, on reasonable rates and terms to be negotiated with requesting parties. This includes both the ability to connect to the public Internet and physical interconnection for the exchange of traffic – KPUD complies, among other things, by complying with Washington State law governing its activities that requires that it offer substantially similar rates and terms to all parties requesting substantially similar services.
